Services in the Chapel of The Order

The following may take place in the Chapel:

- **Memorial Services** - for Knights and Dames Grand Cross only.
- **Weddings** - for members and Medallists of the Order or their children only.
- **Baptisms** - for members and Medallists of the Order, their children or grandchildren only.

There is approximately a two-year waiting list for these services.

All services will be conducted in accordance with the rules of the Church of England.

Centenary Appeal

In connection with the Order's Centenary, we are assisting St Paul's Cathedral in their admirable work to make the Cathedral accessible to everyone. This will take the form of a permanent and architecturally sympathetic access ramp to the North Transept, the estimated cost for the ramp is three million pounds. The new ramp will enable anyone with mobility problems to enter the Cathedral alongside everyone else.

A leaflet providing details of this project is enclosed with your warrant of appointment, along with a pre-paid envelope, should you wish to donate towards this permanent addition to the Cathedral's architecture.

Centenary Window

To celebrate the Centenary of the Order of the British Empire, 1917-2017, the Order commissioned a stained-glass window to replace a plain glass window situated at the entrance to the Chapel. The selected artist, Caroline Benyon, is in the process of finishing the installation of the window which will be completed early 2018.

Annual Evensong

The first annual Evensong took place in St Paul's Cathedral on Tuesday 10th November 2015 attended by the Grand Master and 600 members and Medallists of the Order and their guest. Evensongs have continued and they are a great opportunity to meet with fellow members and to share the good work they have achieved. The Officials, OBE Chorister, Organ and Choral Outreach Fellow and members of the Order take part in the service.

The next Evensong is due to take place in the autumn of 2018, the date will be announced on the website in August. To apply for tickets, please write to: The Registrar of the Order or apply online via the Order's website.

If you are unable to attend the Order's Evensong in November, there is a daily evensong in St. Paul's Cathedral, which is open to members of the public at 5pm (Monday-Friday) and 3:15pm (Sunday) They are free to attend without pre-booking a ticket.

Ceremonial Service in 2020

The next Ceremonial Service will take place in 2020. Notices regarding such Services are published in the Press inviting members and Medallists of the Order to apply for a ticket. The date will be announced on the Order's website in January 2020.

Due to the size of the Order this service will be open to members and Medallists only. It will not be possible to bring a guest. In the event of oversubscription there will be a ballot.

Chorister Scholarship

In 2003 a Chorister Scholarship was introduced to cover the boarding and music fees for two Cathedral Choristers, who would have been unable to attend the Cathedral school without this financial assistance. In 2015 this was reduced to one Scholarship to focus additional funding into the Organ and Choral Fellowship.

The currently OBE chorister is:

Ndiana Essien. Ndiana is in his final year and is the Deputy Head Chorister. He is making excellent progress in trumpet and piano.

The Chorister, can be identified by the OBE badge he wears when on duty.

The Choristers finished 2017 with their current album "Jubilate: 500 Years of Cathedral Music" being number one in the Classical Music Charts.

Organ and Choral Fellowship

In 2014 Mr Tom Daggett was selected as the first Organ and Choral Fellow, initially this was for a 3 year period which was extended for a further 3 years in 2017. Sponsored by the Order, its aim is to share St. Paul's Cathedral musical heritage with primary schools in London.

It seeks to enrich curricula, inspire young minds and promote a deeper understanding of Cathedral music. It does this through singing and organ workshop days in schools and by introducing the William Drake OBE Organ in the OBE Chapel to diverse young audiences.

Since his appointment, Mr. Daggett has worked with over 5,000 children from inner-city London Schools. The programme has recently appeared in the Church Times.

History of the Order

On 15th December 2017 The Reverend Canon Professor Peter John Galloway OBE, published a revised history of the Order following its original publication in 1996.

New chapters discuss the periodic debates about changing the Order's name and case studies of the earliest forfeitures of membership. The list of Knights and Dames Grand Cross has also been updated with information from the London Gazette about each individual. A new appendix lists those whose membership has been forfeited and there are many new illustrations.
